PRIMARY PRESIDENCY

The purpose of Primary is to teach children the gospel of Jesus Christ, help them learn to live it, strengthen testimonies, and prepare them to make and keep sacred covenants.

WHAT AM I CALLED TO DO?

Assist parents and the priesthood in bringing “to pass the immortality and eternal life of man” (Moses 1:39) by watching over and strengthening children ages 18 months to 11 years.

- Prepare spiritually.
- Participate in councils.
- Minister to children and leaders.
- Teach the gospel of Jesus Christ.
- Administer the Primary program.

HOW DO I PREPARE SPIRITUALLY?

- Study the scriptures.
- Pray, ponder, be worthy, and listen for revelation.
- Obey the commandments and exemplify gospel standards.
- Rejoice in the privilege to serve.

WITH WHOM DO I COUNSEL?

Plan and solve problems as you counsel with:

- Your presidency.
- Your priesthood adviser.
- Ward or branch council members.
- The stake Primary presidency.

HOW DO I PARTICIPATE IN COUNCILS?

- Prepare yourself to receive revelation.
- Represent the needs of children and their families.
- Offer observations, concerns, and recommendations on a variety of agenda items.
- Follow the direction of priesthood leaders.

HOW CAN I MINISTER TO:

- *Children:* Activate and retain children as you help them feel loved, learn the gospel of Jesus Christ, and feel the Spirit.
- *Leaders:* Motivate and strengthen leaders as you orient, build relationships, and give ongoing support.

HOW DO I TEACH THE GOSPEL TO CHILDREN?

- Love those you teach.
- Teach the doctrine in leadership meetings, classes, and activities.
- Teach by the Spirit.
- Invite diligent learning by helping children apply gospel principles.

ADMINISTER THE PRIMARY PROGRAM

WHAT TOOLS HELP ME TEACH AND MINISTER TO CHILDREN?

Scriptures

- Help children understand, love, and apply the scriptures. Use them in every part of Primary.

Sunday Instruction

- Opening or closing exercises
- Sharing time
- Music time
- Class

Faith in God

- Use *Faith in God* to help children live the gospel.
- Exemplify and teach “My Gospel Standards.”
- Encourage children to memorize the Articles of Faith.

Annual Gospel Instruction

- The Children’s Sacrament Meeting Presentation allows children to teach and bear testimony.
- The Priesthood Preview is under the direction of the bishop and helps 11-year-old boys prepare to receive the priesthood.

Scouting (U.S. and Canada)

- Provide opportunities for boys to learn, serve, and practice Christlike skills.

- Meet with my presidency.
- Prepare for Sunday Primary.
- Get to know the children.

WHAT'S NEXT?

- Continue to learn your responsibilities as you meet regularly with your priesthood adviser and stake Primary presidency.
- Continue to study the handbook and counsel with your presidency.
- Implement what you learn as needs and resources allow.
